*Dear Readers, Fellow Geomorphologists,*

We are proud to present the tenth issue of *Landform Analysis*. It was primarily published as an yearly journal, but in 2007 the Executive Committee of the Association of Polish Geomorphologists (APG) decided to change its character into a publication series. This resulted in publishing five successive issues (Vol. 5–9) over the last two years, for which we would first and foremost like to thank the guest editors and authors of these volumes. In 2009, following efforts taken by the Executive Committee of the APG, we achieved our original aim – all articles that had been published so far in paper form were posted as digital articles available in the PDF format on the *Landform Analysis* website ([www.sgp.org.pl/la](http://www.sgp.org.pl/la)). On one hand we want to popularize our publication series among potential readers, on the other – we hope to encourage a wide group of guest editors and authors to publish their scientific achievements with us. We do not restrict the publication as to its content. It can take the form of monographic studies as well as a collection of scientific papers on any geomorphological problem or one specific subject. We allow publications by one or many authors. We also accept different kinds of scientific and polemic notes from the field of geomorphology as well as proceedings from geomorphology conferences and workshops. We are ready to include advertisements of other publishers with a similar scientific profile and different companies which produce scientific equipment and apparatus for geomorphologists. Instructions for potential authors have been updated.

Our aim is to make *Landform Analysis* a fully electronic geomorphological publication in the near future, a publication indexed in world bibliographic lists and published by one of the professional electronic publishers. Perhaps this will help to transform *Landform Analysis* into a periodical journal on geomorphology with a wide range of readers, who are both Polish and foreign. We therefore invite all of you to use the opportunities created by the *Landform Analysis* publication series to the fullest extent possible. We encourage authors of monographs as well as organizers of conferences and workshops on geomorphology to use pages of *Landform Analysis*. We have secured enough material for at least three successive issues. Finally, I would like to thank guest editors and all the authors who submitted papers published in this issue. I also thank reviewers who made sure that the materials published contribute to the increasing quality of *Landform Analysis*.
